PROSPECTIVE PLANTINGS FOR MONTANA: WHEAT

National Agricultural Statistics Service NASS: All wheat acreage is expected to total 5.21M acres for 2025. Winter wheat seeded last fall for harvest in 2025 is estimated at 2.30M acres, up 350K acres, or 18%, from the area seeded in 2024. If realized, this would represent the largest planted area since 2015. Growers intend to seed 760K acres of durum wheat this year, down 120Kacres, or 14%, from last year. Growers intend to seed 2.15M acres of spring wheat this year, down 300K acres or 12% from 2024.
