This rather strangelooking photograph is of a wheat stem cut by a wheat stem sawfly immature (or

larva). After feeding inside the green stem, the larva moves to the bottom of the ripening stem when the larva is full-grown at the end of the wheat growing season. Here, it cuts the stem with its mouthparts and fills the space inside the cut area with a frass plug (frass is a term for excrement produced by a plant-eating insect). The larva then resides below the frass plug in the wheat stub where it hibernates over the winter. During the late spring warming of the soil, it transforms first into a pupa and then into an adult where it

chews through and exits this frass plug.

Bob is the department head for the Department of Land Resources & Environmental Sciences at Montana State University; David runs the Wheat Stem Sawfly Laboratory in same department.
